

About TIDMUN

The Tuticorin Intra-District Model United Nations (TIDMUN) is a platform for high school students to engage in meaningful discussions on global issues. Modelled after the United Nations, our conference provides a unique opportunity for suidents to step into the shoes of diplomats, tackle pressing international problems, and develop their leadership skills.

TIDMUN was designed to showcase a model United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) as a platform for the school students to compete and demonstrate their debating skills while addressing some of the pressing issues of the world. UNGA is the main deliberative, policymaking, and representative organ of the UN. Comprising all 193 Member States, it provides a forum for countries to discuss and address a wide range of global issues, including peace and security, development, human rights, and international law.



Each school will register online (date mentioned below) through a link available on the school's website: www.thevikasa.edu.in. Each participant will be a part of delegation to represent a country of UNGA. A delegation must comprise of 2 participants. Schools may send any number of delegations.

Upon successful registration, the host school will organise an online orientation (date mentioned below) for all the participants debriefing on the nuances of MUN and competition procedures in detail. During which the topic for the competition will be discussed. Likewise, each delegation will be assigned a country through an online-lot system. Thereafter, the delegations work on their material and get ready for the competition. There will be an online follow-up (date mentioned below) session with all the delegates to know their progress and address any concerns they might have.
